

appended setting forth that the several petitioners are qualified voters of said township and themselves subscribed the same personally or authorized the same, and the board being satisfied that at least three fifths of all the qualified electors have signed said petition It is Ordered that all persons owning any horses, colts, mules, mule colts, jacks, or any description of cattle in the township of Willow Springs in the county of Douglas shall keep them confined in the night time from the first day of April to the first day of November in each year. It is further Ordered that the County clerk make a certified copy of this Order and cause the same to be published in the Weekly House Journal for three weeks.

The board adjourned until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.

The said William McKinney having made application for licence to keep a Ferry on the Kansas river at the town of Beacomtown and the board believing that such ferry is necessary for the accommodation of the public It is Ordered that the County clerk issue a licence to said Wm McKinney upon the payment of the sum of ten dollars into the County Treasury which sum is hereby fixed as the amount of licence, for one year from the first day of April 1873

A certified copy of the report of the District Judge and County attorney on the condition of the County jail, having been filed in the County clerk's office it was read and ordered placed on file.
