review of county road

The reviewers having filed their report with a survey of said road the report was read. Ordered, that that the report of the reviewers with the plat and survey be recorded.

In the matter of the petition of
R. J. Petty and others for the al-
teration of a county road

Said petitioners having made application for the alteration of a road established October 3^d 1871 on the petition of William Millner and others, as follows, beginning at a point in said road at the South East corner of Section five (5) township twelve (12) Range twenty (20) thence vacate all of said road to the North line of the South East quarter of said Section five (5), and have the same located as follows beginning at a point thirty (30) rods West of the South East corner of Section five (5) aforesaid thence due North as near as practicable about one hundred and twenty rods thence by the most practicable route to intersect said road. And R. H. Petty and George Shearer two of the petitioners having filed their bond payable to the State of Kansas for the use of the County of Douglas, in the sum of two hundred dollars, conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses accruing upon said application, in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, which bond is accepted and approved, And it appearing that said petition is signed by at least twelve householders of the County of Douglas, and that notice of the presentation of said petition has been given according to law. It is ordered that E. Eilenberger, D. H. Lewis and E. Zimmerman three disinterested householders of the County be, and they hereby are appointed viewers and S. C. Darling, Surveyor of said alteration of road, and that they meet at the place of beginning designated in said petition on the eighteenth day of September AD 1873 at two o'clock
