The board of county commissioners of the county of Douglas met pursuant to law thus were present. O. Darling chairman of the board, commissioners Grover and Distrow and Paul R. Brooks county clerk.

The following proceedings were had in the matter of the application of Fred. Corkhill and others for the vacation of a part of the town site of Prairie City.

This being the day fixed for taking testimony in regard to the occupancy of the lands described and sought to be vacated, and no person appearing to protest against it, it is ordered that the county clerk prepare a certificate in the name of the board, (upon the payment of all costs) as required by law and file the same in the office of the Register of Deeds.

Ordered that the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the general fund of the county, raised by tax levy for the year 1873 for the purpose of building a bridge over Deer Creek in Kawwaka Township and it is further Ordered that William Brass Township trustee of Kawwaka Township be and he is hereby appointed a commissioner to advertise for proposals for building a bridge at the point above named, and to superintend the building of the same at a cost to the county of not to exceed the sum of \$750.

The board proceeded to estimate and determine the amount of money to be raised for County purposes and for interest on outstanding bonds for the ensuing year with the following result.
