

Friday January 9th 1874

The board of county commissioners of the county of Douglas met pursuant to adjournment there were present commissioners

The following proceedings were had.

The county clerk presented county warrants to the amount of sixty seven and fifty five one hundredths, Dollars that had remained unclaimed for the period of three years which were examined with the record and ordered cancelled by the clerk and were destroyed by burning

The board proceeded to select a list of persons to serve as petit jurors a list of which was compiled and filed in the county clerk's office

In the matter of a fine imposed by George W. Smith Esq Justice of the Peace in and for the City of Lawrence upon Josephine Hugonot for the offence of Intemperance

A fine having been imposed on the said Josephine Hugonot on the 16th day of April 1873 and said fine being in amount Twenty five Dollars It appearing to the board from the statement of George J. Barker Esq County attorney and Samuel A. Riggs that the said Josephine Hugonot was at the time of the commission of said offence a young girl, that it was a first offence, that there were circumstances of mitigation and that she is unable to pay the same or any part thereof in consideration of these facts, and it being the opinion of the board that no public interest or policy will be subserved by committing her to the county jail It is ordered that the said fine be and the same is hereby remitted
