The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, met at the office of the County Clerk, pursuant to adjournment, there were present Commissioners Deskins and Clark, and the County Clerk, J. B. Smith.

The Board resumed the examination of the annual report of receipts and disbursements, by the Treasurer, of the County, for the year ending July 13th 1874, and find the same correct and on motion, said report was approved.

The Bond of James E. Watson, as Treasurer of Douglas County, for the term of two years from the first Tuesday in July A.D. 1874, was filed, and duly approved according to law.

The Board of Commissioners adjourned until September 7th 1874, at One O'clock P.M.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met at the County Clerk's office, pursuant to adjournment, and pursuant to Law - There were present Commissioners Deskins, Zimmermann, and Clark, and the County Clerk, J. B. Smith.

The following proceedings were had -

This being the day fixed by law, for the Board to determine the amount of money to be raised by tax for the year A.D. 1874 for the various funds required to be provided for, and to make the levy on the property subject to taxation in the County, and there being petitions numerously signed by citizen tax payers of the County, praying the Board to refuse, and neglect to levy any tax to pay interest on the County Bonds issued to Rail Road Companies, &c. Motion, it was resolved by the Board that further consideration of this matter be postponed, until Monday, September 14th 1874.
