

Lawrence Kansas October 7th 1874

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met at the County Clerk's office, pursuant to adjournment, there were present, Commissioners Deskins and Clark, and the County Clerk, J. B. Smith

The following proceedings were had

The Board had under consideration, matters relating to roads

In the matter of the petition of Jacob M. Spittler and others for a change of a certain road

The Viewers appointed by the Board July 27th 1874, as appears on page 302 of this record, having made their report in favor of the change of said road as prayed for in the petition, and said report having been read and remonstrance of C. H. & F. M. Monroe being filed, and all things fully considered, it is Ordered by the Board, ^{that} the prayer of said petitioners be granted and change of said road allowed upon the condition of the payment by said petitioners of the sum of ten dollars to the said C. H. & F. M. Monroe - their damages, claimed before the said Viewers and by them allowed - which sum is paid, as per receipt filed with papers in this case

It is further ordered, that the County Clerk issue in the name of the Board, the necessary order for the opening of said change of road, according to law

In the matter of the petition of E. Jones and others for the establishment of a road

The Viewers appointed by the Board July 27th 1874, as shown on page 301 of this record, having made their report in favor of the establishment of said road as prayed for in the petition, and said report having been publicly read, and all things fully considered, and the Board being of the opinion that said road as laid out and surveyed will be of public utility, and the petitioners agreeing to pay certain damages claimed but not allowed by the viewers, it is Ordered by the Board that said petition be granted, and said road be, and it is hereby established, and that the report of the viewers, with the plat and survey of said road be recorded -

And it is further ordered that the first half mile of said road
