The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met at the County Clerk's office, pursuant to adjournment, there were present Commissioners Deskins, Clerk, and Ginneman and the County Clerk, J. B. Smith -

The following proceedings were had -

The Board proceeded to open, and consider the bids received pursuant to notice, to furnish the County with Coal for the ensuing year - Bids were examined, made by the following persons to wit: W. M. Culbertson, W. Gleson, James A. Boring & H. S. Clark, and after due deliberation, and consideration, it was Ordered by the Board, that the bid of W. M. Culbertson, proposing to furnish to the County of Douglas twenty five hundred bushels (more or less) of best quality Fort Scott, red, or black coal, at twenty and one half (20 1/2) cents per bushel be received, and that the County Clerk be, and he is hereby authorized to draw up and sign a contract for the County Commissioners, with the said W. M. Culbertson, in accordance with the terms of said bid.

The Board had under consideration, the subject of adding certain Bonds and Mortgages to the assessment roll, the same not being listed by persons holding them, and certain persons having had notice according to law, appeared and gave testimony relating thereto, and various persons came forward and consented to the adding to the list such amounts as were found they were chargeable with.

Washington Hadley, President of the National Bank of Lawrence appeared, and presented a petition requesting relief, in the matter of the assessment of the property of said Bank - which was laid over for future consideration.

The Board had under consideration the matter of the repairs of the "Poor Farm Bridge", and it appearing to the
