

and others submitted a proposition to rebuild the said bridge, which was considered, and on Motion, all further action was postponed until such time as advertisement can be made for proposals and bids to be received and acted on, in conformity with requirements of law -

Ordered that William Means, bridge Commissioner be directed to advertise for bids, and the letting of a contract for the rebuilding of the "Poor farm Bridge", the same to be of new materials, with the exception of the irons, using the same as in the old bridge -

C. W. Babcock, president of the Lawrence bridge Company, appeared upon invitation of the Board, to consider the matter of increasing the assessment of the property of said Company, or of assessing the stock of the Company, and the said C. W. Babcock, president of said Company consented that the Company be assessed on their bridge in the sum of \$30,000, and upon "Stock" of the said Company in the sum of \$5,000, and he agreed to pay the taxes chargeable on said amounts, reserving the privilege of having endorsed on the tax book, "paid under protest - on 'Stock'"

In the matter of the Assessment of the Lawrence Gas, Coke and Coal Company's property,

It appearing that said Company had not been assessed by the Assessor of the City of Lawrence, and the matter being under consideration by the Board, Notice having been issued to the president of said Company to show cause why they should not be assessed in a specified amount, A. M. Wilder, President, and N. J. Stevens attorney for said Company appeared, and asked further time for the Company to respond which request was granted by the board, and further action in the matter postponed until October 31st 1874 -

The board proceeded to examine and cancel the County orders, which having been issued more than three years, are yet in the order book, unclaimed, as provided by law which were cancelled on the record of issue, as follows -
