

Lawrence Kansas November 7th 1874

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County, sitting as a board of Canvassers, met pursuant to adjournment, at the County Clerk's office. There were present, Commissioners Deskins and Clark, and the County Clerk, J. B. Smith.

The Board continued the Canvass of the votes cast at the general election, and completed the same, and made their determination of the same, as shown by the abstracts on file.

The Board having completed their labors as a board of Canvassers, adjourned the same time & place.

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The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County, met at the County Clerk's office, on the call of the Chairman, for a special session, at the request of two members. There were present Commissioners Deskins and Clark, and the County Clerk L. B. Smith.

The following proceedings were had.

Ordered that each Judge, and Clerk of Election, who served as such, at the general election, November 3rd 1874, in those several wards of the City of Lawrence, and each voting precinct in the County, be allowed the fees as prescribed by law to wit - Two dollars each, as such Judge or Clerk, and One dollar, and mileage allowed by law to the Judge returning the copy of the Poll Books and election returns.

Ordered that an appropriation of Thirty dollars be, and the same is hereby made from the general fund of the County, for the Superintendent of the County Payroll.

In the matter of Assessment of the Lawrence Gas, Coke, and Coal Company.

A. M. Wilder president of said Company appeared before the Board, and consented to the property of the said Company being assessed and put upon the Books for taxation, as follows, to wit - Reserve No. Eleven (11) in the City of Lawrence, with all the appurtenances thereto belonging at thirty
