A remonstrance of C.B. Becks and 38 others against any change of School District No 17, being made, Ordered by the Board that the Supt. of Public Instructions be notified to meet with the Commissioners Wednesday, Jan'y 27<sup>th</sup> 1875, to confer in relation to said matter -

C.B. Smith, Co. Clerk presented a request to the Board, for an examination of his accounts and bills allowed for the year past - upon which no action was taken by the Board, and the request was placed on file -

On request of the Trustees of Willow Spring Township, the office of treasurer of said township was declared vacant, and the Board appointed W.N. Plank treasurer to fill said vacancy -

It was Ordered by the Board that a special meeting of the Board be held, to meet with the Trustees of the several townships and the County superintendent of Public Instruction, on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January ad 1875 -

The Board proceeded to select names of suitable persons to serve as jurors in the District Court sitting in and for Douglas County, for the ensuing year, according to law -

The Board adjourned until tomorrow morning Jan'y 16<sup>th</sup> 1875. At nine O'clock A.M.
