Lawrence Kansas January 27th 1875

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County, met in Special Session at the County Clerk's office, agreeable to resolution passed Jan'y 15th 1875. There were present Commissioners Deskins, Clark and Zimmerman, and the County Clerk J. B. Smith -

The Trustees of the several townships made their report, in the matter of relief needed by the citizens of each School district - side of the City of Lawrence, with the following result. To wit: "We the undersigned, being without means of support for ourselves and families and teams, and being without means of procuring seed for spring planting, hereby certify that we are in absolute need of the articles set against our respective names, and we hereby agree that in case the County of Douglas, Kansas, shall furnish us with the said articles, or any of them, we will pay the said County the cost and value thereof within one year." And the following table shows the aggregate of persons signing said list in each township, and the aggregate amount of articles needed, to wit -
