

Lawrence Kansas, February 17th 1875
 The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met at the County Clerk's office, in Special session, there being present Commissioners J. L. Clark and S. T. Zimmerman, and the County Clerk J. B. Smith.

The Chairman being absent, on suggestion of Commissioner Zimmerman, J. L. Clark was chosen to act as temporary Chairman.

The following proceedings were had -
 In the matter of Complaint by a pauper from the County Asylum in regard to mistreatment by the Superintendent L. S. Moore, the Board examined several persons, and listened to the statement of Charles Leime in relation to treatment received from Mr. Moore, when upon a full investigation of the subject, the Board were satisfied with the explanation of the matter, and the Supt. was exonerated from any blame in the premises.

The Board adjourned until tomorrow Feb 18th 1875 at nine O'clock A.M.
