

Lawrence Kansas February 25th 1875

The Board of Commissioners met in Special Session, at the Co. Clerk's office - there were present Commissioners Clark and Finerman, and the County Clerk J.B. Smith - S.L. Clark acting Chairman, pro tem.

S.W. Riggs Esq, Attorney for James Blood, ex County Treasurer, appeared before the Board, and asked for time to examine the bill of items of difference in said James Blood's accounts, as reported by the investigating Committee before any further action be taken thereon.

The Board adjourned until tomorrow February 26th 1875 at nine O'clock A.M.

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met pursuant to adjournment, at the County Clerk's office - there were present Commissioners Clark and Finerman and the Co. Clerk J.B. Smith - S.L. Clark acting Chairman Pro tem -

James Blood, ex County Treasurer appeared with S.W. Riggs his attorney, and upon their request, the Board Ordered, that James Blood have access to the Books and papers in the hands of the investigating Committee, to examine the same in connection with and by the assistance of W.T. Sinclair member of said Committee -

It was Ordered by the Board, that the investigating Committee continue their work of investigation, and investigate and examine the transactions of Paul R. Brooks former County Clerk

Blankets having been received from the Secretary of State Board of Agriculture, for collecting statistics of destitution, agreeable with act of Congress approved July 10th A.D. 1875, the Board Ordered that the County Clerk be instructed to notify the several township Trustees to proceed at once to collect the information desired and report the same to the County Clerk, as soon as possible.

The Board adjourned until tomorrow, at nine O'clock A.M.
