

Lawrence, Kansas April 13th 1875-

The Board met pursuant to adjournment. There were present Commissioners Deskins, Zimmerman and Clark and the County Clerk H.B. Smith.

The following proceedings were had

It was Ordered by the Board that bids for medical attendance, at the County Asylum, and jail for the ensuing year, be received, until 12 O'clock M. April 16th 1875, and that the Clerk give notice of the same through the daily papers of the City.

Ordered by the board, that in the distribution of the seeds received from the Agricultural Department at Washington D.C., that 132 packages be delivered to the Mayor of the City of Lawrence for distribution in said City and the balance be turned over to the Township Trustees of the several townships, pro rata deduction from Wakarusa and Palmyra townships the amount they have respectively received direct from the Agrt Dept. to wit: Palmyra 88, and Wakarusa 125 packages -

In the matter of the Petition of
Thos. H. Conner, for leave to maintain
Gates on a public road.

It was Ordered by the Board that the prayer of the petitioner be granted, and that since Thos. H. Conner be permitted to maintain convenient Gates, where the public road enters and leaves the East half of the South East 1/4 Section 18, Township 18, Range 20, for a time sufficient to grow a hedge, not to exceed five years unless the public convenience require it sooner opened.

The resignation of Earsen Wicks Treasurer of Clinton Township was received and accepted, and the Board appointed Gabriel Mackey Treasurer of Clinton township to fill said vacancy -
