The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met at the County Clerk's office, pursuant to adjournment. There were present Commissioners Deakin, Clark, and Zimmerman and the County Clerk, J. B. Smith.

Now comes John Dean, one of the signers of said petition and files his bond in the sum of Two hundred Dollars, as provided by law. Condition for the payment of the costs and expenses accruing upon such application, in case the prayer of the petition be not granted, or the proceedings had in pursuance thereof should not be finally confirmed and established; which bond is accepted and approved. And it appearing that said petition is signed by at least twelve freeholders of Douglas County residing in the vicinity of the proposed road; it is Ordered, that David Kerns, James E. Carpenter, and L. C. Marshall, three disinterested freeholders of the County be, and they hereby are, appointed Viewers, and J. C. Darling Surveyor, of said road, and that they meet at the place of beginning of said proposed road, on the 27th day of May A.D. 1875, and after being duly sworn proceed to perform the duties of their several appointments, according to law. It is further Ordered that the County Clerk issue, in the name of the Board, the necessary order to said Viewers and Surveyor and that said Viewers and Surveyor report their proceedings in the premises to this Board at its next regular session.
