

tion line between 16 & 21, to see corner of 16 & 17, 20 & 21, and that so much of the road running East and West, along or near the above described line, known as the P. H. Taylor road established April 8th 1865, and so much of the road petitioned for by W. B. Barker et al, and established July 7th 1869, as may vary and deviate from the road sought to be located by this petition be vacated.

And now Comes Ebene Baldwin one of the signers of said petition, and files his Bond in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, as provided by law, with D. G. Watts as surety, Condition for the payment of the costs and expenses, accruing upon said application, in case the prayer of the petitioners be not granted, or the proceeding had in pursuance thereof be not finally confirmed and established; which bond is accepted and approved. And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board, that said petition is signed by at least twelve householders of said County of Douglas, residing in the vicinity of the proposed location and vacation of road, it is Ordered that A. Cook, Andrew Douglas, and George W. Cady, three disinterested householders, of the County be, and they hereby are, appointed Viewers, and J. C. Darling Surveyor of said road location, and vacation, and that they meet at the place of beginning of said proposed location of road, on the first day of June AD 1875, and after being duly sworn, proceed to the discharge of the duties of their several appointments, according to law. And it is further Ordered that the County Clerk issue in the name of the Board the necessary orders to said Viewers and Surveyor, and that said Viewers and Surveyor report their proceedings in the premises to this Board at its next regular session -
