In the matter of Certain Court Orders, which have been taken from the Order Book, in which such orders or warrants are kept without being accepted for in said Book, or marked in any way to show how, by whom, or when such orders were taken, or given out, was taken up, a portion of said Court orders having been turned over to the Board by the Co. Treasurer at his annual settlement July 12th 1874. the same having been paid by him, and also certain orders having been cashed by C. R. Brooks, as stated by the County Treasurer and his deputy, which the stub book shows are not marked in any way, and whereas certain parties have made affidavit setting forth that they have not received the money for such orders, or given any order on the County Clerk for said order, or authorized any one, to act for them in the premises, also Sarah Barrett presented to the Board, April 15th 1875 a certificate of the Clerk of the District Court of Anderson County, setting forth that said Sarah Barrett was a witness in the Medlin Case - and she demanded of the County Clerk of Douglas County, the County order for said services, or fee due her, and it appearing that such County order drawn Nov. 28th AD 1872, No 9882, in favor of Sarah Barrett had been taken from the book, and the stub marked "Del on Order," said County order having been paid by the Co. Treasurer Nov. 24th 1873. as shown by the Treasurer's cancelling stamp on the order turned over to the Board at his annual settlement in July 1874, and said orders returned by the Treasurer showing that quite a number of them had been paid during the term of office of the present incumbent, T. B. Smith; Therefore, said T. B. Smith, County Clerk made peremptory demand that the Board should take such measures as will protect him in the premises -
