

and J. C. Darling Surveyor of said road, and that they meet at the place of beginning of said proposed road, on the 2^d day of June A.D. 1875, and after being duly sworn, proceed & discharge the duties of their respective appointments, according to law.

It is further Ordered that the County Clerk issue, in the name of the Board the necessary order to the Viewers and the Surveyor, and that said Viewers and Surveyor report to this Board their proceedings in the premises at their next regular session.

The Board adjourned until April 20th 1875 -

The Board met pursuant to adjournment, at the County Clerk's office, There were present Commissioners Deskins Clark, and Zimmerman, and the County Clerk J. B. Smith. The following proceedings were had -

Upon the representation of Maj. J. B. Kennedy, Dr A. Newman, and other citizens of the County, setting forth the conditions and circumstances of J. W. Thornton, a very worthy citizen who was wholly disabled by Quattrelli's banditti, and the Board believing that he and his family may be saved from becoming paupers, by having his homestead which has been sold for taxes, secured to him, it is Ordered, that an appropriation of One hundred and thirty three & 2/100 dollars be, and it is hereby made from the General fund of the County, for the purpose of redeeming said homestead, Lot No. 178 City street Lawrence from tax sale of 1873 and subsequent taxes paid thereon -

Ordered that the County Clerk notify the treasurer of this order.

Upon petition and request of Citizens of Palmyra township, the Board Ordered that a fine of One hundred dollars against B. G. Pickett, be remitted, upon his paying the costs of the prosecution - said fine was imposed by the District Court about April 17th 1874.
