The Board of County Commissioners met at the County Clerk's office pursuant to adjournment. There were present, Commissioners Deskins, Clark, and Zimmerman and the County Clerk J. B. Smith.

The following proceedings were had.

Resolved by the Board, that the County Clerk be instructed to notify the Committee heretofore appointed to examine the condition of the County Asylum; that it is the desire of Board that said Committee meet with the Commissioners at the County Asylum, on the 10th day of May A.D. 1875, at 10 O'clock A.M. in order to confer together in relation to the subject matter of their former report made to this Board.

In the matter of the Petition of }
Wm McKinney for a License to }
run a ferry across the Kansas }
River at the town of Leecompton }

The said Wm McKinney having filed his bond as required by law, and the Board being satisfied that said ferry will be of public utility, it is Ordered by the Board, that he be allowed a license to run a ferry across the Kansas River at the town of Leecompton, in Douglas County, for the term of six months from and after the 1st day of April A.D. 1875, and that he be allowed to collect tolls at the following rates to wit: For a two horse team & wagon forty (40) cents; for one horse and buggy thirty (30) cents; for one horse & rider twenty (20) cents; for single horse Cattle, Sheep or hogs ten (10) cents each. And the Board being satisfied that said ferry is of public benefit, and of little use as not to justify the payment of license, it is granted without requiring the usual license fee to the County, upon the said Wm McKinney, paying to the Clerk his fee of One Dollar in issuing the same.
