

Lawrence Kans. May 10th 1875

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met pursuant to adjournment. There were present Commissioners Grimmerman, Clark and DesRives, and the County Clerk I. B. Smith.

There being a Car load of Corn in the car, received at the L. & N. E. depot, directed to the County Clerk of Douglas County, the Commissioners Ordered, that it be turned over to G. W. Goss, as agent to sell the same at reduced price to the farmers of Douglas County most needing assistance to procure seed

Upon the recommendation of Geo. W. Smith Esq, before whom James Williams was sentenced to six months confinement in the County Jail for petty Larceny, Dec. 30th 1874; the Board, Ordered that said James Williams be discharged from Custody, Subject to payment of costs, according to law- Ordered that the Clerk notify the Sheriff of this order-

In the Matter of the report of the
Committee, on Condition of Penitentiary Asylum

Only one member of the Committee appearing, the Board after having carefully considered the matter, concluded, that the report of the Committee, as far as it relates to the improvements recommended by the Committee to be made to the Asylum, was in the main correct, but that the same is not practicable under the present financial condition of the County.

The Board adjourned sine die
