

It was Ordered by the Board, that the Petition of Hugh Cameron, for a licence to run a ferry across the Kansas River, at Glen Burn, be granted for one year from the 1st day of June 1875, and being satisfied that the amount of public travel will not justify him in paying a fee to the County, Ordered that Licence be issued to said Hugh Cameron, upon his paying the Clerk's fee of One dollar, for Licence issued - And it was further Ordered that he be permitted to charge, not to exceed the following rates of ferriage: To Wit: For a ^{two horse} team and wagon forty (40) cents, for One horse and buggy thirty (30) cents, for One horse and rider twenty (20) cents; for single horse, Cattle, Sheep, or Swine, ten (10) cents each

Ordered that J. E. Labor be appointed as Road viewer, in the matter of the Petition of J. Howell and others, for a change of a County road, in place of G. C. Brackett, who is unable to attend

The Board Adjourned until nine o'clock A.M. tomorrow

It was Ordered by the Board, that, where one half of all taxes except the Special pavement tax in the City of Lawrence, were paid on any lot in said City December 21st 1874, that all penalty added to the unpaid portion of said tax, except the Special pavement tax, be remitted, and the County Treasurer is hereby Authorized and instructed
