Lawrence June 2^d. 1875

The Board of Commissioners met at the County Clerk's office pursuant to adjournment. There were present Commissioners Clark, Deskins and Zimmerman and the County Clerk J. B. Smith.

The following proceedings were had

Commissioner Deskins offered the following Resolutions, 1st. Resolved, that we do emphatically reject and deny, and refuse to recognize the contract as set up by the Attorneys as made by the former Board of Commissioners, in the suit of Douglas County vs. the L. S. & Galveston Railroad Company, and we do further refuse positively to make any contract with them, and 2^d be it further Resolved that we do positively deny that Douglas County owes the said Attorneys any fees as claimed by them, and we do refuse to audit or allow them anything, upon their claim submitted, and demanded of the County. Commissioner Deskins moved the adoption of the Resolutions, and demanded that the vote be taken on each resolution separately, by aye and nays, which was had as follows - On the 1st Resolution Commissioner Deskins voted yea and Commissioners Clark and Zimmerman voted No, and as the resolution was not adopted. The vote being taken on the 2^d resolution Commissioner Deskins and Clark voted yes, and Commissioner Zimmerman voted No, and as the 2^d resolution was adopted.

G. W. Babcock, and Isaac Kilworth, presented a Memorial and obligation signed by citizens and business men of Lawrence, to protect the County Commissioners from all liability for appropriating the sum of two thousand dollars, from the general fund of the County, to purchase seed corn and potatoes for the citizens of the County who have been rendered destitute
