

Lawrence Kansas

July 5th 1875

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met pursuant to law, at the office of the County Clerk, and went into session as a Board of Equalization, at two O'Clock P.M. - There were present Commissioners DesKines, Clark, and Zimmerman, and the County Clerk J.B. Smith.

The County Clerk laid before the Board, the returns of assessments, made by the several township and City assessors in the County, and the Board proceeded to examine the same and equalize the assessments of the value of the Real Estate as provided by law. a record of which proceedings is entered in the Book of "Record of Equalization".

The Board adjourned until 9 A.M. tomorrow.

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County, met pursuant to adjournment, there were present Commissioners Zimmerman, Clark, and DesKines, and the County Clerk, J. B. Smith.

The following proceedings were had

The petition of Jacob Rehn and Peter Nies, praying for privilege to erect and maintain Gates, where the County line road between Douglas and Johnson Counties, intersects the north and south boundaries of the South $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$, and the North $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 10, Town 13, Range 21; for a time sufficient to grow a hedge, not exceeding five years, being presented, and there being no objection made, the prayer of the petitioners was granted, and it was Ordered by the Board that the County Clerk issue a certificate to the said parties.

The Board went into session as a Board of Equalization, and at 5 O'Clock P.M. adjourned until nine O'Clock A.M. tomorrow
