

Lawrence Kansas, July 16th 1875
 The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met
 at the County Clerk's office, pursuant to adjourn-
 ment. There were present Commissioners Deskins,
 Clark, ^{and} Zimmerman, and the County Clerk T. B. Smith.

In the matter of E. Baldwin et al
 for the location, and vacation of
 a part of a County Road,

The viewers appointed at the
 April Session, as appears on page 397 of this record,
 having made their report in favor of the same, and
 said report having been this day publicly read and
 duly considered, and the Board being of the opinion
 that it will be of public utility, accept the report of
 the viewers therein, and grant the prayer of the petitioners.
 And Order that said road be located, and a portion
 of a road vacated, as reported by said viewers and the
 Surveyor, and also allow as compensation for land taken,
 and for damages sustained by reasons thereof, the following
 sums, to wit. To J. W. Harrison, One Hundred Dollars,
 and to J. Letterington Ten dollars, and the said sums be
 hereby appropriated from the General fund of the County.
 It was also further ordered that the Clerk issue in the
 name of the Board, the necessary order for the opening
 of said road according to law.

In the matter of the appeal
 of School District No. 81, from
 the action of the Co. Superintendent of Public Instructions, by
 request of the Superintendent, was taken up, and request of
 parties interested, the matter was continued until Friday
 July 30th 1875.

In the matter of the Petition
 of David S. Clark et. al, for permission to erect and
 maintain gates, on a public road, on the north line of
 section 16. Town. 44. Range 21. where said road intersects
 the east and west boundary lines of the North East quarter
 and the East half of the North West quarter, of said section.
 The Board having considered the same, grants the
 prayer of the petitioners, upon the conditions, that provided
 the public good demands it, the Commissioners have the
