

Lawrence, Kansas, July 28th 1875

Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met at the office of the County Clerk, pursuant to adjournment, there were present Commissioners Deekins, Clark, and Zimmerman, and the County Clerk J. B. Smith

The Board had under consideration the assessment of mortgages, that were not listed by the holders according to law, and examined several parties in relation to the same.

In the matter of the Relinquishment of E. Baldwin et al. for the location and vacation of part of a Co. Road. The views appointed by the Board, at the April Session, 1875, as appears on page 397 of this Record, having made their report in favor of locating said road, and vacating a portion of a road as prayed for in the petition, and said report was publicly read, and the Board being of the opinion that the Road as surveyed would be of public utility and benefit, and that all things pertaining to the location thereof had been legally done, except the report of the viewers and surveyor, and Ordered that the prayer of the petition be granted, and the road established as prayed for, and the portion of a road vacated, agreeable to the report of said viewers and surveyor, and further Ordered that County Clerk record the report and field notes in the Road Record, and issue in the name of the Board the necessary orders for the opening of said road according to law. The Board also allowed, and appropriated from the General fund of the County, as pay for land taken, and damages sustained by location of said road, the following sums, to wit: To J. H. Harrison, One hundred Dollars, and W. L. Herrington, Ten Dollars, and instructed the Clerk to draw orders on the Treasury for said amounts in favor of said persons.

The Board adjourned sine die.
