The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County, met at the County Clerk's office pursuant to adjournment when there were present, Commissioners Jernstrom and Deskins, and the County Clerk, J. B. Smith.

The Board had under consideration the assessment of mortgages, and correcting the list of personal property returned by sundry persons, after giving such persons a hearing, or taking their testimony in regard to their interest therein.

O. E. Leonard appeared before the Board in behalf of the L. S. & Galveston R. Road Company, and made the following proposition, or demand to the Board - He proposed to settle the delinquent taxes against said Company on the following terms - The County to remit the ten per cent added to the valuation of the Real Estate of said Company by the State Board, of Equalization, in 1874, and the personal property tax to be based upon the valuation returned by said Company, instead of that made by the assessors, and the County Board to remit all penalties that have attached, or been added. And he assured the Board, that its compliance with said propositions will insure the prompt payment of the tax as aforesaid. The Board, in response, agreed to remit the amount of taxes on the ten per cent valuation, added by the State Board, upon said Company's paying the balance of the taxes and penalties so charged against it.
