

Lawrence Kansas November 8th 1875

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met pursuant to law, as a Board of Canvassers, to canvass the votes cast at the General election, for members of the Legislature, County and Township officers, held on the 2^d day of November A.D. 1875. - There were present Commissioners Deskins, Clark and Zimmerman and the County Clerk J. B. Smith -

The Board examined the report of L. B. Tuttle, as Justice of Polunpa Township, and approved the same -

The County Clerk laid before the Board, the returns of election, as returned by the judges of the several election precincts in the County, and the Board proceeded to open and examine the same, and after a careful comparison, made and signed an abstract of votes cast for the several persons voted for, and also of the votes cast for, and against the proposed amendments to the State Constitution, which abstracts were ordered to be filed in the County Clerk's office.

Upon a canvass of the votes cast for Road Overseers in the several townships, the following named persons were found to have received the same number of votes, and the Board thereupon proceeded to make choice by lot, as provided by law in cases of a tie vote - and declared the following named persons to be drawn and elected -
To Wit:

In Road District No. 1 Leecompton Township, F. M. Crowder and A. Gentry having received each four votes; by lot F. M. Crowder was drawn.

In Road District No. 1. Kanwaka Township, R. Rickards and John Kelley having received each three votes, and by lot John Kelley was drawn.

In Road District No. 9. Kanwaka Township, F. Hendricks and R. Seaton having received each four votes, by lot, R. Seaton was drawn.

The Board adjourned until nine o'clock tomorrow A.M. to complete the Canvass - Attest
