

Lawrence Kansas, December 24th 1875-

The Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met at the County Clerk's office, pursuant to adjournment - there were present, Commissioners Clark, Zimmerman, and Deskins, and the County Clerk J. B. Smith.

The Order of the Board made on the 13th day of October 1875 in words as follows to wit: "Ordered that Robert Young make out a bill of particulars in case of Douglas County vs W. S. Beach" said order is hereby amended, and W. J. Sinclair is added to said order.

In the matter of School District No. 81 @ 60, being under consideration, was not finally acted upon.

The Board adjourned until Monday December 27th 1875 at 10 O'clock A.M.

Lawrence Kansas December 27th 1875

The Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment - There were present Commissioners Zimmerman, Clark and Deskins and the County Clerk J. B. Smith.

The Bond of F. G. Dickens, Constable for Beacompton Township was approved.

The matter of controversy between School districts 60 and 81 being under consideration, Commissioner S. L. Clark offered the following preamble and Order, which on a vote being taken was adopted - to wit:

Whereas, on the 28th day of April AD 1875 a portion of School District No. 81, was, and has been absorbed by the extension of the City limits of the City of Lawrence and added to district No. 60 by virtue of Ordinance No. 196, approved April 28 1875, of the City Council of the City of Lawrence, and Whereas, the School board of School district No. 81 has levied a tax for School purposes in said district - And Whereas, the School board of School district No. 60 has levied a tax for School purposes, on the lands and property covered by said city extension heretofore
