

On representations of the Sheriff and others the Board
Ordered that H. Johnson be released from jail and the County
 Clerk was instructed to notify the Sheriff of the Order in that respect.

The Board had under consideration a bill of W. J. Cummings for
 \$6.20 claimed as fee as witness in District Court July 5th 1875
 see Bill No. 3813 The payment of the same being recommended
 by the County Attorney it was allowed at \$6.20

Pending the consideration of applications for the super-
 intendency of the Poor Asylum the Board adjourned until
 to-morrow morning at 9 o'clock.

The Board of Commissioners met at 9 o'clock pursuant to ad-
 journment. There were present Clark, Destines & Pochler and
 the County Clerk J. B. Smith.

The matter of letting the Poor Asy-
 lum was again considered and after carefully examining all the
 propositions it was

Ordered that a contract be made and entered into with W. B. Ful-
 lerton to take charge of the Poor Asylum and farm for one year from
 the 1st of March next. (See Contract filed in this office January 28th A.D.
 1876 signed by W. B. Fullerton and the Commissioners).

The subject of the school tax in District 81 was brought before the Board
 for re-consideration and after listening to representations from parties interested it was
Ordered That the County Clerk be and is hereby instructed to assess for
 school purposes all the real and personal property embraced in school
 District 81 on the first day of March 1875 as belonging to said district, and
 to strike off any other school tax that may appear on any of the above
 mentioned property and insert the school tax of District 81 as levied by
 the officers of said District 81 in the year 1875.

Ordered furthermore That the preamble and "Order" regarding school
 District 81 passed by the Board of Commissioners on the 27th day of De-
 cember A.D. 1875 as they appear on the Commissioners Record, pages 491
 and 492 be and are hereby revoked.

On motion of Commissioner Destines it was
Resolved by the Board that H. H. Nevison County Attorney be requested and
 required to commence suit forthwith against James Rhoad for deficiency
 as late County Treasurer of Douglas County Kansas, and that the County Clerk
 notify the County of this order of the Board.
