

Ordered That the Judge of the District Court be and is hereby requested not to have the printing of the Court Calendar done at the expense of the County; and that the County Clerk be instructed to notify the Judge of this order of the Board.

The Board had under consideration the suit brought against Paul P. Brooks late County Clerk for a deficiency due the county, as found and reported by what is known as the "Investigating Committee". Mr. Brooks being present the Board proposed to him as an amicable mode of settlement that the parties interested would examine the Books and papers, commencing to-morrow morning, to ascertain the amount of deficiency, if any. As condition of entering upon this investigation Mr. Brooks demanded that the suit instituted against him be withdrawn. This the Board declined to do, but agreed that if the investigation showed a deficiency when it was paid, or secured to the county the suit should be withdrawn. Mr. Brooks replied that he would take it under consideration and withdrew from the Board.

No further business coming before the Board it adjourned until to-morrow morning 9. O. Clock

The Board of Commissioners met at 9. O. Clock pursuant to adjournment. There were present Deshens Pochler and Clark and J. B. Smith the County Clerk.

Mr. J. P. Vaughn made application for the purchase of the County's interest in Blocks 30-31-32-33-34- and 35 in Old Palmyra and it was Ordered by the Board that the county assign its interest in said blocks on the payment into the County Treasury of one dollar and five (1.55) cents a lot.

The Board had under consideration the subsequent assessment of the personal property of G. H. E. Griffith when it was Ordered That the County Clerk be and is hereby instructed to strike from the tax roll of the year 1875 four hundred and eighty seven dollars and seventy two cents (\$487.72) of the personal property of G. H. E. Griffith said amount being a subsequent and erroneous assessment.

The claim of C. A. Meenger for \$183.94 for "Illegal sale" certificate No. 310 Sale of 1871 attached was considered and it was Ordered by the Board that the bill be Rejected.

Pending the consideration of the Railroad bond question the Board adjourned until to-morrow morning at 9. O'clock.
