Laurence Douglas County Kansas April 10th A.D. 1876.

The Board of County Commissioners met in the office of the County Clerk according to the requirements of Law. There were present Messrs Destines and Clarke. and J. B. Smith County Clerk, Mr. Pochler being absent on business of the Board.

On a motion of Commissioner Destines Mr. Clarke was made Chairman protem. The record of proceedings of the Commissioners from and including January 3rd to and including March 27th A.D. 1876. was publicly read, corrected and approved.

A petition signed by thirty citizens of Endora praying the Board of Commissioners to grant a Ferry License to David Coop to run a Ferry at the crossing known as the Black Jack and Leavenworth State road was considered and it was

Ordered That the License for one year ^{legitimate} on payment of the License fee of one dollar and filing the lawful bond; and that he be at liberty to collect toll at the following rates To wit;

For a two horse team 40cts - one horse & buggy 30cts.
One horse and rider 20 " - Single horse, cattle ship or hog 10cts

After having agreed to proceed at once to the Poor Farm to look after its management the Board adjourned until tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock.
