Lawrence Douglas County Kansas, April 17th 1876.

The Board of Commissioners met in the office of the County Clerk at three o'clock P.M. There were present Doehler, Clark and Destine and Deputy Co. Clerk B. F. Diggy.

The Board proceeded to open the bids for County Printing. There were three bids: One from Spear & Co.; Journal Company; and J. F. D. Shiff. After an examination of the propositions the award of the Contract was postponed until tomorrow. Ordered that the Co. Clerk be instructed to write to the Secretary of the Interior to ascertain the condition of the title of the following described land to wit: E 1/4 of S.W. 1/4 of Twp. 14 Sec 1 - Town 13, Range 20 N 1/2 of S.W. 1/4 Sec 1. Town 13, Range 20.

The bonds of Charles Chadwick J.P. and S. J. Phillips & Joseph M. Parnham Constables elect were examined and approved by the Board. Ordered That L. S. Moore late Superintendent of the Poor Asylum be and is hereby instructed to pay into the County Treasury Four dollars and fifty cents for Sumner received from County Bridge. In the matter of employing a Physician for Poor Asylum

Doctor B. G. Miller submitted the following bid for Poor Asylum physician:

Lawrence Kansas April 17th 1876.

To the County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas Gentlemen: I will visit patients at the County Infirmary for one dollar and twenty five cents a visit making no extra charge for additional patients. For all prescriptions at the Office I will charge twenty five cents. I will visit patients at the County Jail for fifty cents a visit making no additional charge for extra prescriptions.
