

In the matter of employing legal assistance for the County Attorney in the case of Alex. Anderson charged with Arson, it was Ordered That whereas W. M. Merison County Attorney has requested the Board to employ counsel to assist him in the prosecution of the case of the State of Kansas vs. Alexander Anderson charged with Arson, said action now pending in the District Court of Douglas County; it is hereby ordered that said Merison is authorized to employ N. Hoysradt esq. to assist him in said trial on the part of the State provided, ^{said} Hoysradt will assist free of charge to the county.

On a motion of Commissioner Destines the vote by which a Ferry License was granted to Baber & Thompson was reconsidered and the petition was continued for further consideration.

Ordered that for and in consideration of immediate ^{payment} of the forfeited bond given the State of Kansas by Mrs. Schofield & Jerry Glatthart the Board authorizes the County Attorney to deduct twenty five dollars from the amount of the bond.

In the matter of the proper regulation of the Poor Asylum

Commissioner Destines offered the following resolution which after consideration by the Board was adopted. Resolved

That the Supt. of the Poor farm Asylum be requested and required to make a report to the Board at each regular meeting of the same which shall include a detailed and itemized account of every article, of what kind of clothing, shoes, boots, tobacco, and everything furnished to the paupers, giving day and date when delivered and take a receipt of all parties capable of giving one. And further that said Supt. be required to purchase a pass book and that when he buys anything that he require the merchant to enter in said book with ink in his own hand making every article bought.

In the matter of bids for County Printing

The bids being under consideration the Board awarded the contract to Spurr & Corl publishers of the "The Tribune" as the lowest bidders. The same being twenty three cents for a 1000 lines for all insertions including tax lists and all other legal printing and the Co. clerk was instructed to enter into contract with Messrs Spurr & Corl accordingly and to have a bond with sufficient surety executed for a faithful performance of the contract.
