

\$5486⁴⁸ per mile being the value per mile of said railroad as fixed by the State Board of Equalization.

- B. The valuation of tools and materials in Grant Township shall be corrected so that such property be prorated according to the law of 1875. But such compromise shall not be construed to release the Company from the penalties or any sum due from them in addition to the sum paid by them on or about Dec 20th 1875 as the first half of the taxes for 1875 but they shall pay the legal penalties on such sums.

After due consideration and a careful examination of the law under which the assessment of 1875 was made the Board

Ordered that the proposition be accepted provided that the taxes be immediately paid on the basis proposed.

In the Matter of the purchase
of the Lawrence Bridge

Mr. Isaac Kilworth appeared before the Board in behalf of a committee of the City Council of the City of Lawrence and discussed the feasibility of the County buying the Lawrence Bridge spanning the Kansas river at the north end of Massachusetts street. After carefully considering the proposition it was decided to be inexpedient to submit a proposition of the kind under the present financial embarrassment of Douglas County.

No further business coming before the Board and having considered and determined the questions on which the call was made, it adjourned sine die
