The Board having under consideration the settlement of the taxes due from the St. Louis, Lawrence and Southwestern railway, and the Kansas Midland railroad for the year 1875 it was

Ordered That the County Treasurer be and he is hereby instructed to receive in settlement of the taxes charged against the St. Louis, Lawrence and Southwestern Railway taxes charged on the basis of the valuation as returned by the State Board of Railroad assessors for the year 1876 - providing that said taxes be paid immediately.

Ordered that the County Treasurer be and he is hereby instructed in the settlement of the taxes charged and due from the Kansas Midland railroad Company to remit the last half (June payment) of taxes charged on rolling stock - to wit, \$25.61 in the City of Lawrence; \$29.36 in Wakarusa Sp. and \$70.4 in Leocompton Sp. provided that said taxes be paid immediately.

In the matter of the Settlement of
of Road Taxes for 1876 3

This subject being under consideration with a view of how most to accommodate the taxpayer and meet the requirements of the law with the County Treasurer it was

Ordered That Road Overseers be and are hereby instructed, that in giving receipts for paid up road taxes, that two, or duplicate receipts be given, numbered 1 & 2. - the first one or No. 1, ^{containing 1/2 the amount of taxes} to apply on the payment of taxes due the 20th of Decr. 1876 and number two to apply on the taxes due June 20th A.D. 1877. and the receipts shall so specify.

provided that this order shall not be so construed as to prevent any person from paying the whole amount of taxes charged against him on or before the 20th day of December and applying both receipts on the same.

No further business coming before the Board it adjourned Sine die
