

Lawrence Douglas County Kansas June 30th A.D. 1876.

The Board of Commissioners met in the office of the County Clerk pursuant to the requirements of law to canvass the returns of the Special election ordered May 25th and held in pursuance thereof June 24th. A.D. 1876. There were present John Destinus and Samuel L. Clark and B. F. Diggs esq. clerk. The chairman of the Board Mr. Pochler, being absent, Mr. Destinus was chosen chairman pro tem.

The following is an Abstract of the votes cast at the special election held in the several voting precincts of Douglas County, State of Kansas on the 24th day of June A.D. 1876 on a proposition to compromise the Leavenworth, Lawrence and Galveston railroad bonds.
