

Lawrence Douglas County Kansas August 8th. A.D. 1876

The following call for a special meeting was addressed to the Hon John Deskins Chairman of the Board of Commissioners.

You are hereby requested to call a special meeting of the Board of Commissioners for the purpose of correcting the returns of the assessor in the case of the Douglas County Loan & Savings Association; The Union Building and Savings Association; The Lawrence Building and Savings Association; the North Lawrence and Railroad Savings Association and to consider the matter of alleged illegal taxes in that portion of the city of Lawrence known as the Garrett Strip, and for the appointment of a County Commissioner

Whereupon the following order was issued to the County clerk

You are hereby directed to call the special meeting requested above for this day 8th of August 1876. John Deskins, Chairman Board.

There were present at said special meeting Commissioners Deskins and Clark and Co. Clerk B. F. Diggs and the following proceedings were had. Mr. George Shearer having failed to accept the appointment of Commissioner tendered him on July 3rd. On motion of S. L. Clark Mr. Isaac Kilworth was appointed Commissioner to fill said vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Hon. Fred Drehler.

In the matter of correcting  
The assessment of Lawrence

Building & Saving Association Mr. T. H. Rudder Secretary of the same appeared before the Board and accepted the assessment of the same as an association whereupon the Board

Ordered that the said association be permitted to pay the taxes due from 1875 on the basis of said assessment for 1876 and the County Clerk was directed to notify the County Treasurer of the said action of the Board.

In the matter of correcting the  
Assessment of North Lawrence and Railroad & Savings Association Mr. A. Evans acting for the association accepted the assessment of the same as an association whereupon the Board

Ordered that the said association be permitted to pay the taxes due for the year 1875 on the basis of said assessment for 1876 and the County Clerk was directed to notify the County Treasurer of the said action of the Board.

The consideration of the question of illegal taxes on what is known as the Garrett Strip was postponed until the October session of the Board. No further business coming before the Board under the call it adjourned sine die
