

Lawrence Douglas County Kansas October 25th 1876.

Hon. John Festinus Chairman of the Board called a special meeting for this day and date on the application of S. L. Clark and Turner Sampson for the consideration of the following subjects.

1st. The matter of refunding taxes claimed to be illegal paid by R. S. George or his agent W. M. Cockins

2d. The matter of refunding certain taxes claimed to be illegal and paid by W. A. Rankin

3rd. The matter of refunding certain taxes claimed to be illegal against the estate of Lewis Williams

4th. To consider certain applications for appropriations to repair Eadsa Bridge, to build bridge across Captains creek; to build bridge across a ravine or ditch $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of the town of Clinton;

5th. The matter of refunding certain taxes claimed to be illegal wherein A. J. Menger & Geo. Shearer are parties—property in North Lawrence

6th. To make arrangement for the care of John McQuinn—an insane person

7th. To consider alleged illegal assessment presented by Col. Beane, on Blocks 11 Lots 1 to 10 inclusive in Town Bound.

8th. To consider the matter of remitting the fine and imprisonment of Nathaniel Frazer now confined in jail.

There were present John Festinus, Samuel L. Clark and Turner Sampson and B. H. Diggs Co. Clerk.

In the matter of Nathaniel Frazer.

Confined in County jail. It was ordered on a motion of Comm. Clark that he be released from custody and the fine be remitted on the payment of costs; and the County Clerk be and is hereby instructed to issue this order in the name of the Board to the Sheriff forthwith.

In the matter of the

Care of John McQuinn. An agreement is hereby made and ordered with Nancy McQuinn to care for board and clothe John McQuinn from July 17th 1876 to January 1st. 1877 at the rate of two dollars a week.
