

of the old and outstanding bonds at the rate of fifty cents on the dollar To wit \$162,500 and to pay 7 percent interest thereon payable semi annually-said bonds payable thirty years from date: And the County Clerk shall make the necessary publication and furnish Poll Books and do whatever is necessary to carry out such election & the Sheriff shall make due proclamation of said election as required by law. And in all respects said proposition shall conform to the requirements of Chapter 49 of the laws of 1876.
