

Laurence Douglas Co. Kansas April 13th A.D. 1877

Board met pursuant to adjournment in the office of the County Clerk. There were present John Walton, Geo. Leary and the Chairman John Destiney the County Clerk Diggs.

Ordered That the balance in County Treasury to the credit of the redemption and assignment fund be and the same is hereby transferred to the general fund of the County and the Co. Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify the Treasurer to make the transfer on his books.

Others Petition for a road 33

Be it remembered that on this 13th day of April A.D. 1877, a road petition signed by G. O. McLeane and others was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas praying for the location of a certain road, described as follows— Commencing at the North East Corner of Section 4, Township 15 Range 18 on the Santa Fe road thence South one mile on section line to the S.E. Corner of Sec 4 T. 15. R. 18 thence East half mile to the S.E. Corner of the S.W. 1/4 of Section 2 Township 15 R 18 to intersect a road running north and South.

Said petition was accompanied with bond as required by law, signed by G. O. McLeane as principal and John Kelly and J. D. Banker as sureties in the penal sum of One hundred dollars; Whereupon said bond was approved by the Board and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that the law had been substantially complied with, it was ordered that Moses McCallum, Lewis Bear & Theodore Glidden be appointed viewers of the proposed road and that they meet in conjunction with the County Surveyor at the place of beginning on the 7th day of June A.D. 1877 and proceed to view and lay out said road according to law giving all parties a hearing and make due report of their proceedings to the Board. And the Clerk is hereby instructed to issue the legal notice to the viewers & Surveyor and caused to be published & posted the necessary notices—
