Lawrence Douglas County Kansas Aug 25th 1877 Saturday

The Board met in the office of the County Clerk pursuant to adjournment. There were present John Deskinies John Walton and Geo. W. Cady and the County Clerk B. D. Diggs. The Board continued the settlement with the County Treasurer until a difference arose as to whether the Treasurer should be charged with fees for advertising lands & lots sold for delinquent taxes; whereupon it was agreed to submit the following to the County attorney for his opinion.

For advertising delinquent Taxes 1873 there were advertised for sale 2394 Town Lots and 1324 tracts of land for which each town lot so advertised was charged with ten cents and each tract of land twenty five cents and such amounts placed upon the tax roll as an additional lien upon said land and lots.

Should the County Treasurer be charged with the amounts so placed upon the roll and required to account for it in the same manner the balance of Taxes on the roll Sec 21.60.
