The viewers appointed at the July session see page 59 of this record made the following report which was publicly read - In obedience to your order issued at your July session A.D. 1877 we the viewers appointed under said order met with T. C. Darling Surveyor at the place designated on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of Aug and were severally sworn to discharge faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order. Edward Ward and E. H. Avery were selected by us as Chain Carriers and W. B. Kennedy as a Marker who were also duly sworn. We then proceeded to view said proposed road on the line described in your order and caused the same to be surveyed as prayed for in the petition or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility convenience and inconvenience, and expense, which will result to individuals as well as the public by the location of said road as shown by the field notes and plat of the survey herewith filed, and we would respectfully report that the said road ought to be established for the following reasons That it will be a public convenience which requires that such road shall be established 6 feet in width.
