In the matter of Petition of Arthur Gilman & Others for the location of a certain road

The Viewers made report which was publicly read that said road ought to be established because the public convenience demands it and a good road can be made along the line surveyed and viewed with a very trifling expenditure of money and labor. He also determined that the Public convenience demands that said road should be established Forty feet in Width (110 ft in Width) Whereupon A. H. Fouts Esq. appeared for the Petitioners and presented the claims of the road prayed for, and D. S. Alford appeared for the objectors & other Remonstrants. After hearing both parties the Board dismissed them and reserved their decision.

In the matter of a Petition by T. H. Gill for the Location of a certain road This being the day set apart for the consideration of the same. The Viewers report was publicly read which is That the said road ought to be established for the following reasons The public convenience demands it and a good road can be made along the route surveyed at a trifling cost in Labor and Money and that public convenience requires that such road be established Forty feet in Width (110 ft) The petitioners and remonstrants stated their case to the Board when it adjourned reserving its decision that they might further consider the question of damages The Board adjourned until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
