

my duty to hold said office until I can safely turn the same over to a duly elected and qualified or duly appointed and qualified successor.

Having been advised by Counsel that there exists grave doubts about the validity of the recent election of a County Treasurer to fill a vacancy which occurred by operation of law on the 29th day of October last and that it (is) questionable if my responsibility and that of my bondsmen would cease upon a surrender of the office by me to a person declared to have been chosen Treasurer at that election and that it is undoubtedly your right and duty to make a declaration of a vacancy and appoint some suitable person to fill said vacancy, I would respectfully suggest and ask that you relieve me from any and all embarrassments in the premises by declaring the vacancy and appointing some suitable person to whom I can surrender the office and whose receipt to me for funds turned over will be a legal voucher
