The motion to adopt the resolution being seconded, the
 question was put by the Chairman, Shall the resolution
 be adopted? The vote being taken, Commissioner John
 Deskinies voted "no" and Commissioners John Walton
 and John E. Walton voted "I" and so the resolution
 was adopted and Oliver Barber was declared appointed
 Treasurer of Douglas County, and the County Clerk
 instructed to issue his Certificate of appointment
 No further business coming before the Board, the Board
 adjourned until tomorrow morning at 10 O'clock A.M.
