The Board of County Commissioners went to Topeka in obedience to an order of Judge Dillon to answer the Mandamus of said Judge and show cause why they should not be punished for Contempt.

The case came up before the Court on the 5th and the Judge decided they must give bond in the sum of \$10000. that they would not resign their office and for their appearance at that Court on the first day of the March (next) term and they were given until Tuesday to file the bond required.
