In the Matter of Petition
of Citizens of Wakarusa
Township for Night Herd Law

The following petition signed by O. A. Hauscom and 390 other citizens of Wakarusa Township was presented to the Board. The your petitioners, legal voters of Wakarusa Township, Douglas County, Kansas, respectfully ask your honorable Board to make an order that all persons owning horses, mules, asses, cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall keep them confined in the night time from the first day of January to the 31st day of December of each year. Said petition was accompanied by the following affidavit:

William Meairs, being duly sworn, says that the petitioners are all qualified electors of Wakarusa Township and number three fifths of all the qualified voters in said Township and did each subscribe his name thereto or authorize the same to be done.

The Board having the petition under consideration passed the following order.

It is ordered, that all persons owning any horses, mules, asses, cattle, sheep, goats, or swine, shall keep them confined in the night time from the first day of January to the 31st day of December of each year.

And that the County Clerk make a certified copy of this order and cause the same to be published three weeks in the official paper of the County.
