all advertising except the Delinquent Tax list and Redemption  
list to have published in the "Kansas Tribune" and "The  
Standard"

for which said lot was sold with interest on the same  
at the rate of ten per cent per annum

On motion it was ordered by the Board  
that Mary C. Chadwick be allowed to redeem lot 71  
New Jersey Street in the City of Lawrence from the tax  
sale of 1864 for the tax of 1865 upon the payment by her of  
the amount for which said lot was sold, \$10<sup>00</sup> and  
Cost of Redemption, without interest
