Board of County Commissioners met in special session on the call of the Chairman at the office of the County Clerk.

Those were present Commissioners John Deskinen, Chairman, John Walton and J. C. Walton and County Clerk B. F. Deiggs.

In the matter of Compromising
the R.R. bonded indebtedness of
the County.

The Board having under consideration the Rail Road bonded indebtedness of the County, now John Walton introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption. Whereas the people of Douglas County have voted to Compromise their Rail Road Bonded indebtedness at a sum not to exceed fifty cents on the dollar, and Whereas it is deemed expedient and necessary in order to effect said compromise, that some person be sent East to confer with the Bond holders.

And Whereas the County Commissioners who are the proper persons for such mission are under arrest, making it impossible for them to go.

Therefore Resolved, That we proceed to appoint some person to act as agent for the County, with full powers to compromise said indebtedness at a rate not to exceed fifty cents on the dollar as voted by the people.

Commissioner J. C. Walton seconded the motion to adopt the Resolution and on the vote being taken Commissioners John Walton and J. C. Walton voted Aye. and John Deskinen voted "No." and as the resolution was adopted.
