The total estimated expenses of the County for the coming year being \$29075.⁰⁰ to which was added twenty per cent as provided by law to cover uncollected taxes making a total of \$34890.⁰⁰ to be levied for. The assessed valuation of the County being \$4,856,380.⁰⁰ it was estimated that a levy of Seven and one half (7½) mills on the dollar would raise the amount.

A Contract having been made for the construction of four Iron Bridges in the County, the expense of the same to be about \$10,000.⁰⁰ it was estimated that a levy of two mills on the dollar would raise the necessary amount.

The Commissioners having passed a resolution to compromise the rail road bonded indebtedness of the County at fifty cents on the dollar of the bonds and accrued interest, it was estimated that a levy of Six mills on the dollar of all the taxable property in the County would raise the amount necessary to pay the interest on the compromise bonds to be issued in place of the old bonds.

It was moved by Commissioner J. C. Walton that a levy of Seven and one half (7½) mills on the dollar of all the taxable property in Douglas County, for paying the general expenses of the County as estimated above, and also a further levy of a special tax of two (2) mills on the dollar of all the taxable property in the County to pay for the construction of four Iron Bridges now under contract to be built, as follows, one at Eudora, one at Sigel and one at Hutchinson Crossing, all on the Wakarusa River and one at Robinsons Crossing on Mud Creek, all in Douglas County, Kansas, and also that a further levy of Six mills on the dollar of all taxable property in the County to provide for the interest on the compromise bonds to be issued in compromising the Rail Road bonded indebtedness of the County be made for the coming year, which motion was seconded by Commissioner John Walton.

Pending the consideration of the motion, it was moved and seconded to lay the question on the table until tomorrow morning at 9 O'clock A.M.

In the matter
